

The Color Purple: And the Other Four(+) Colors of the Church Year



Dear Friends in Christ,

In life, we sometimes do things without really asking why we do them. Take the colors that we use to highlight in our sanctuary throughout the church year. We have some beautiful paraments, liturgical hangings on and around the altar as well as the pulpit and lectern. We may know that there is a group of volunteers, our altar care team, who change those paraments throughout the church year, but those changes are somewhat of a mystery for most of us. Why do we do use these different colors and what do they represent?

Purple is the color for the season we are now in. There are four other colors (white, red, green, and blue) that adorn our chancel from time to time. Let's take a look at the church year (Advent through Christ the King Sunday in November) and see what colors are used and why we use them. (I will try not to "over explain", which I am sometimes known to do!)

Advent: Blue/*Purple

- When? Late November or Early December until Christmas Day
- Meaning/Representation? Hope and is a traditional color for the Virgin Mary.

• *Until about 50 years ago, this season was usually Purple for Lutherans.

Christmas: White

- When? Christmas Day through, January 6
- Meaning/Representation? Purity, light, glory, and joy

Epiphany: Green. (Epiphany is one of two green "ordinary seasons".)

- When? January 7th to Ash Wednesday
- Meaning/Representation? Life, growth, anticipation

Lent: Purple

- When? Ash Wednesday to Palm/Passion Sunday
- Meaning/Representation? Penance, sacrifice, preparation

Easter: White/Gold

- When? Easter Day until Pentecost Sunday (7 weeks)
- Meaning/Representation? Purity, light, glory, and joy

Pentecost Sunday: Red

- When? Seven weeks after Easter Sunday
- Meaning/Representation? God's love, fire, the Holy Spirit, blood of the martyrs/saints

Sundays after Pentecost: Green. (One of two "ordinary seasons", along with Epiphany)

When? Summer until Christ the King Sunday in November Meaning/Representation? Life, growth, anticipation.

There are some other times when the color for a particular Sunday changes for a single week. Here are some examples...

White: Transfiguration Sunday (the Sunday before Ash Wednesday) Trinity Sunday (the Sunday after Pentecost Sunday), All Saints Sunday (the first Sunday in November), and Christ the King Sunday (late November, the last Sunday in the church calendar)

Red: In addition to Pentecost Sunday, Red is used for remembering certain commemorations like Reformation Sunday (the last Sunday in October) or in remembrance of certain saints of the church on their death days.

In addition, you may have attended a church that used some additional parament colors beyond the five mentioned above. Here are some examples...

<u>Psalm 146;</u> <u>Isaiah 42:14-21;</u> Colossians 1:9-14 **Scarlet (A more crimson red):** Passion/Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday. Emphasizing the sacrifice and royalty of Christ.

Rose: Third Sunday of Advent, Fourth Sunday of Lent). A color representing joy, even in the midst of penitential seasons.

Black: Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and sometimes used for funerals

Unbleached Linen/Beige/Gray: Ash Wednesday or Lent representing repentance or humility.

Gold: Easter Season. Celebrating the triumphant resurrection of Christ

From time to time, paraments wear out. Our green paraments, which get the most use, are starting to show their age. The altar care team is researching the work of some liturgical artists to make us some replacements. There may soon be an opportunity to make gifts to the church for this particular purpose.

A few years ago, my friend Susan Black, an artist and former head of the Aurora Arts Association, wanted to thank the church for the use of our basement for the Aurora Art Show. I knew that she was passionate about liturgical things (She's Roman Catholic) so I asked her to create five oil pastel panels, each in one of the colors that we use in our sanctuary. They sit on top of the church mail boxes that each household uses near the entrance to the sanctuary. I hope to someday soon to find a more permanent place to hang them. Take a look next time you are getting your mail. There is a depth to them that I find intriguing.

All of this from the question, "Why do we use purple?" I probably have over-explained. But if our lives of faith are about finding meaning, I find it comforting to know that color is a catalyst to help us do just that.

May God bless you on your path this Lenten Season and help you to look afresh at all of the colors that surround you everyday. Especially purple!
