Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Three years ago, Apple TV took a chance on a comedy show based on an unlikely premise...What if an American Football Coach (Ted Lasso) was unexpectedly hired to coach an underperforming British Football (Soccer) Team? Would the essence of what made the coach successful at a Division II college football team translate to the other kind of football?

Even though the original intent of the owner was to ruin the team and to get back at her ex-husband, Ted begins to make progress. In the locker room, he mounts a blue and yellow sign above the locker room exit with one single word in all capital letters: BELIEVE. Believe in oneself, believe in the team, believe in ideals and goals, and, as the 1980 US Olympic hockey team made famous, "believe in miracles".

The sign isn't fancy. It looks homemade. When Ted mounts it on the wall, someone points out that the sign is a little askew. But after some attempts to straighten it, it remains a little crooked. Belief doesn't need to be perfect. It just matters that it's there.

Believe. It sounds so simple. I believe. We believe. They believe. Even at U.S.A. Soccer events, where crowds rhythmically chant, "I believe that we will win!", we instinctively know that some days, it's harder to believe than others.

Psalm 33:1-12; Genesis 15:1-20; Matthew 9:27-34 In the Gospel reading for Trinity Sunday from Matthew 28, the eleven remaining disciples meet Jesus in Galilee, where he gives what has come to be known as "The Great Commission". In verse 17, it says of the disciples, "When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted." What a great sentence that it is! Belief is not perfect, even for the disciples.

The Greek word translated as "doubted" can also be translated as "hesitated". Like Ted Lasso's BELIEVE sign, it doesn't need to be perfect or instant. It just matters that it's there.

I also love the reading from Mark where the father of a son in need of healing says to Jesus, "I believe; help my unbelief!" (Mark 9:24b). Our minds want to shout back, "Which is it? Belief or unbelief?" To which Jesus says, "Exactly!"

I remember hearing a story from Susan Briehl, a campus pastor at Pacific Lutheran University in the 1980's and early 90's that she shared at a youth convention. A student came up to her and asked, "What do I do if I come upon a part of the Apostle's Creed in worship that I'm struggling with? Do I still say it?" Her response was, "There are times in our lives when we can say it and other times when we just need to allow others to help us out and say it for us." I believe. Help my unbelief.

If you follow Ted Lasso, you know over three seasons that sign goes through a lot. (I promise, no spoilers!). How members of the team view the sign evolves too. There are ups and downs and the sign even disappears for a time as the team works to embody the sign in their play and in their trust and in their friendships.

The Latin word for "I believe" is "credo". It's where we get the word "creed" from. But a creed doesn't mean our faith has reached its Zenith. There are creeds that begin, "I believe". And others that begin, "We believe". There are days when we worship easily and others when we doubt or hesitate and need help. The words of Jesus still ring true. "Go and make disciples...and I will be with you always, even to the end of the age." Helping us to BELIEVE!

I would like to invite CLC members and friends to bring some of the above-mentioned items on the 2nd Sunday of each month to help as we can. A box or container will be placed in the narthex to receive donations and delivered monthly to the school. We will mark the second Sunday of each month "Undie Sunday" on the calendar as a reminder. North Marion Fellowship has agreed to sponsor a similar program at their church.

One major piece of business at the annual meeting will be to review and vote on a proposed update to our congregational constitution. Council has been working for many months to bring our existing document into alignment with the model constitution of the ELCA. It's an important document for both everyday guidance (Chapters on Confession of Faith, Statement of Purpose, Membership) and special situations (calling of a rostered minister--that is, pastor or deacon--questions of property ownership, etc.). One of the advantages of our affiliation with the larger church is that we are able to learn from others' experience.

We will be making available electronic versions of the current constitution, from 1990, and our draft update. We'll also have a few hard copies. Please take some time to read them, and plan to attend the discussion session after service on June 11.
