

### "Advent: Its Complicated..."

Dear Friends in Christ,

Although it feels a little late this year, welcome to the season of Advent!

The fact that it feels that way is a reflection of the fact that Advent this year is about as late as it can be on the calendar. It's also as short as it can be.

Measured by the four Sundays before the Nativity of Christ December 25, we only get three Advent Sundays before Christmas Eve, with the fourth Sunday of Advent pulling double duty.

On top of that, our Gospel readings for Advent this year come from Mark, the most succinct of the four gospel writers. "Immediately" is one of Mark's favorite words. As I write this December 1, Advent hasn't even started yet, and already I'm feeling rushed.

Or maybe I'm just projecting my own anxieties onto the season. Human beings have a tendency to do that. Especially in situations that are complicated.

### "Advent: Its Complicated..."

So, not only is Advent short and late this year, Advent is always a little complicated. It isn't just one thing. It is a season where we hold in tension the "already" of God with the "not yet" of God.

In some Eucharistic prayers, the celebrant and the people say or sing, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come, come again." The longed for Christ, the present Christ, the coming Christ.

Themes of Advent include hope, anticipation, preparation, promise, and joy. The prayers of the day for the four Sundays of Advent always begin with the words, "Stir up". Stir up your power..Stir up our hearts...Stir up the wills of your faithful people... Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come.

The people of God, stirred up by the Spirit, in a stirred up, mixed up world.

I think Advent is complicated because life is complicated. If we try to limit Advent to being "a season to get ready for Christmas", we constrain the power of the incarnation to touch every facet of the human condition. Our joys and our sorrows. Our roses and our thorns. Our laughter and our tears.

When "the Word became flesh and lived among us," it was to enter fully into our complicated, stirred up lives. Advent reminds us of that.

May the Christ who was, who is, and who is to come be with you this season and always.

### 4-ingredient Chocolate Mint Marble Slice

### 4 Ingredients

2 x 180g blocks dark chocolate, chopped 1 tsp peppermint

essence

2 x 180g blocks white chocolate, chopped Green gel food coloring, to tint

### Step 1

Grease a 20 x 30cm slice pan. Line with baking paper.

### Step 2

Place dark chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on High for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Add the peppermint essence and stir until combined.

### Step 3

Place white chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on High for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Add food colouring to tint green. Stir until evenly coloured.

### Step 4

Spoon large dollops of the dark and white chocolate mixtures, alternating mixtures, into prepared pan. Tap pan on bench until mixture is level. Use a skewer to marble the mixtures. Set aside for 2 hours or until firm. Cut into slices to serve.

### 12:00-3:00 pm


Sort perishable food to each family table
