"What's for dinner?" is such a universal question, that it has become, in many manifestations, the springboard for new entertainment ventures. The Food Network and other food-based television shows have turned this challenging question into a variety of different programs. Some examples...

- The show Chopped gives competing chefs a box containing three or four disparate ingredients that they must incorporate into an edible dish in a short amount of time.
- Chef Gordon Ramsey (America's Top Chef; Hell's Kitchen) sometimes has contestants gather ingredients for a dish, and then make them trade what they have gathered with one another.
- Guy Fieri, better known for his show, Diners, Drive-Ins, and Dives, has a show called Guy's Grocery Games where contestants have a limited time and budget to run around a supermarket grocery store, gather ingredients, and put together dishes with unusual challenges attached.

Part of the popularity of shows like these, I think, is that they share with the viewer a common challenge. What are you going to create using what you have and your Imagination?

On September 21 from 10-2:00 p.m., a group of leaders from Christ Lutheran is going have a strategic visioning session where we will attempt to lay out our priorities and goals as a congregation for the next three years. Like a cooking show, we will ask some questions before we begin...

- What do we already have on hand in terms of assets (human and financial) that we can use? (What's already in our fridge and pantry?)
- Where do we feel God's Spirit is leading us at this unique time and place where we find ourselves as a community? (What do we feel inspired to create?)
- How might we align our priorities for mission with the needs of our community?
- (What do those we want to invite to the table truly need and/or want?).



Is your congregation facing questions about safety concerns? This event is for all congregation leaders, rostered and lay. Whether you are just starting think about security for your church or already have a plan in place, this session is an opportunity to build your deescalation skills with a faithful spirit. It will cover the basics and provide a brief overview of how we communicate to de-escalate, and how to identify and respond to varying levels of escalated behavior with an emphasis on safety and compassion. Presented by Mikaila Maher, LCSW, who is currently supervisor of the BOB Peer and Outreach Team at Providence. She has worked in social services serving unhoused neighbors since 2012, and has been providing de-escalation trainings since 2014. 
Passing of Rick Snell
