Dear Friends in Christ,

Advent begins this Sunday, December 1st. It is one of those rare years that the actual beginning of the season and the first day of Advent are in alignment.

Growing up, my mother would attach a cardboard Advent Calendar to the refrigerator after Thanksgiving.

Sometimes she bought them and at other times, they came from our Sunday School. Starting December 1, my brothers and I would take turns each day at breakfast getting to open each little window and reveal a picture or a scripture reading related to the season. Each open

window marked the progress of the days until the arrival of the big night, December 24th and the morning celebration that followed.

Since those days of my youth, Advent Calendars are only growing in popularity, variety, and complexity. And these calendars are not necessarily religious anymore. My friend, Pastor Dan Hallgrimson, a semi-retired pastor living in Corvallis, has in the past posted daily photos of himself enjoying one of his 24 Advent "Beers from Around the World" Calendar selections and what he paired with each of them.

Southern Living Magazine posted an article online revealing "The 38 Best Advent Calendars of 2024". Among them were A Book Lover's Advent Calendar with a book related accessory like a bookmark or bookplate sticker behind each window.

For fishing lovers, a calendar with 24 different fishing lures, a variety of types, behind each door.

For the baker, Williams and Sonoma has a calendar, "24 Days of Baking Cookies" with an item each day to aid the recipient with all their holiday baking.

There are also all kinds of food related calendars with everything from hot sauce, to cookies, to gourmet chocolates hidden behind each door or window.

There is something in our nature that finds fulfillment in marking time toward a goal as well as growing anticipation in the coming of an ultimate prize. Each of these little Advent windows reveal our progress and give us a little reward to encourage us on our journey. Advent wreathes similarly mark the coming of Christ with weekly candles on their circular journey to the Nativity of Jesus.

What if, on each of Advent's twenty-four days leading up to Christmas, we asked ourselves at the close of the day, "What window did God open today that revealed God's presence in our midst or in my life?" What if we reflected on this question and shared our findings with one another or wrote them down for us to look over at the end of the month?

I like the idea of God opening the Advent windows for us. It rings true to me that Holy Spirit sometimes points out a view, or a person, or an event that we might have rushed past and missed the blessing if we didn't stop to pause.

So, in the busy weeks to come, pause at the metaphorical Advent window each day. Ask, "How has God's presence been revealed to me in my work, or leisure, or struggles?" Looking back, did someone bring healing, or help, or friendship to me? How did they, or maybe, how did I help reveal Christ?

4-ingredient Chocolate Mint Marble Slice

4 Ingredients

2 x 180g blocks dark chocolate, chopped 1 tsp peppermint essence

2 x 180g blocks white chocolate, chopped Green gel food coloring, to tint

Step 1

Grease a 20 x 30cm slice pan. Line with baking paper.

Step 2

Place dark chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on High for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Add the peppermint essence and stir until combined.

Step 3

Place white chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on High for 1 minute 30 seconds, stirring every 30 seconds, or until melted and smooth. Add food colouring to tint green. Stir until evenly coloured.

Step 4

Spoon large dollops of the dark and white chocolate mixtures, alternating mixtures, into prepared pan. Tap pan on bench until mixture is level. Use a skewer to marble the mixtures. Set aside for 2 hours or until firm. Cut into slices to serve.

Gift Tags – We need volunteers to be present at the gift tag bulletin boards and show others how to become a gift donor- the process of taking a tag,

signing your name, cutting the bottom off, etc. – you know what I mean. Let's make a point to help anyone out that may not be clear on what to do.

Total Family Count (13) – this includes the shelter family and displaced families with a total head count of 60.

Key Dates:

- + Now 12/8 all gift tags, food items, etc., need to be purchased by each donor.
- + 12/1- last day to take a gift tag, setup after service in basement to set up tables by family/icon. Last year we had trees with corresponding icons on each table to make it simple. We need all hands on Decemberk to get these tables ready for donors to return their gifts. Who would like to take this task on and organize it? (Please reach out to me, we can use a few folks to help out here).
- + 12/8 first to last day to return gifts and corresponding tags to basement.
- + 12/8-12/9 Volunteers needed to shop for remaining unclaimed gifts and food items and bring to church NLT 12/11.
- + 12/11- final day to drop off ALL ITEMS (gifts, food, etc.)
- + 12/13 come and help wrap any unwrapped gift items.
- → 12/14 (Sat.)-11-1pm. ALL HANDS ON DECEMBERK please come to help presort all items in basement.
- + 12/21 (Sat.) 12-3pm final sorting and delivery of perishable items. Delivery to all families begins between 3pm-6pm. (might be earlier, depending on how fast we get things sorted.) Ideally, if you could be a 'sorter' and delivery driver, that would be IDEAL!
